You Auto Know

About BMW

The company we now know as BMW originated in 1916 with the merger of three other manufacturing companies (with very complicated German names)—Rapp Motorenwerke, Bayerische Flugzeugwerke, and Fahrzeugfabrik Eisenach. BMW became an automobile manufacturer in 1929 when it purchased Fahrzeugfabrik Eisenach, which built Austin Sevens. BMW's team of engineers progressively developed their cars from small Seven-based cars into six-cylinder luxury cars, and, in 1936, began production of the BMW 328 sports car.

Pots, pans, and bicycles?

Aircraft engines, motorcycles, and automobiles would be BMW's main products until WWII. But during the war (against the wishes of its director), BMW concentrated on aircraft engine production, with motorcycles as a sideline, and automobile manufacture stopped altogether. After the war, BMW survived by making pots, pans, and bicycles until 1948.

Starting over...

The first BMW vehicle to take to the road after WWII ended was the R 24 motorcycle, followed by the 501 "saloon" car in 1952. As a luxury car, the BMW 501 was not a commercial success, but it nevertheless restored BMW's status as a manufacturer of high-quality, technically exciting cars.

More Computer than Car?

We're all hearing about selfdriving cars as the way of the future. Stunning new prototypes are appearing in the media on a regular basis, tantalizing us with promises of hassle-free driving and eased congestion on the roads.

Mother's Day Flower Pot Craft for the Kiddos

What you'll need...

- 1. Plastic milk or juice jugs
- 2. Fabric or scrapbook paper
- 3. Scissors
- 4. White craft glue
- 5. Paintbrush
- 6. Potted Flower

How to...



Cut off the top of the plastic jug, just under the handle. Then, turn the jug upside down and poke four small drain holes in the bottom.

Cut fabric or tear paper into 1 inch squares, and then mix 2 parts glue and 1 part water in a bowl. Paint the glue mixture onto the outside of the jug. Decoupage the fabric or paper all over the jug, and (optional) glue a strip of complimentary fabric or paper around the top of the jug.

Add a handful of gravel to the bottom of the jug and some soil. Finally, add your potted flower!

Talking Tech— Good Communication Makes Auto Repair Easier

We know—an unexpected, budget-busting auto repair is stressful. In fact, one of the worst parts of our job is to confront drivers with bad news about their vehicles. And while we strive to explain necessary auto repairs as delicately and sensitively as possible, we understand you may still feel upset when we present you with a poor diagnosis. We believe—just like in any relationship—good communication is an excellent antidote for conflict. Here are some suggestions for talking tech, and getting the most from your auto repair experience.

Be specific when describing a problem with your vehicle. For example, "I'm hearing a high-pitched squeal between 50 and 60 miles an hour that seems to come from the left-rear wheel is much more helpful than, "The wheel is making funny noises." Mention all your observations, even if you don't know if they're relevant.

Don't self-diagnose. Targeting and accurately identifying problems in complex modern vehicles is a specialized skill best left to an auto repair technician, not Google. Automakers have established procedures to determine the cause of most vehicle issues, which must be followed before undertaking repairs.
